### RECREATIONAL FISHERIES DATA ANALYST

**Location:** Arlington, VA

**Duties:** As **Recreational Fisheries Data Analyst**, the incumbent is responsible for ongoing implementation of state conduct of Marine Recreational Information Program (MRIP) surveys on the Atlantic coast, including the Access Point Intercept Angler Survey (APAIS) and the For-hire Telephone Survey (FHTS). The incumbent provides program support to partner agencies conducting MRIP surveys from Georgia through Maine and acts as a liaison between the Atlantic Coastal Cooperative Statistics Program (ACCSP) partners conducting MRIP surveys. In addition, the incumbent will support other aspects of the ACCSP program and perform related duties as the ACCSP evolves. ACCSP utilizes Oracle and SAS software for data storage and dissemination. The position of **Recreational Fisheries Data Analyst** is based out of the Arlington, Virginia office of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) and will require some overnight travel, primarily along the Atlantic coast. The incumbent reports to the ACCSP Director through the Recreational Team Lead. This position is not qualified for overtime, however compensatory time and flexible working hours (including part time telecommuting with supervisory approval) are available under the Commission's policies. The **Recreational Fisheries Data Analyst** is a salaried employee and is expected to put in the effort required to make the ACCSP successful.

**Qualifications:** A graduate degree in fisheries science, marine biology, or related field. Experience and knowledge of Atlantic coast recreational fisheries surveys, related data collection programs, and data management using relational databases (such as Oracle) is highly desirable. Proven writing and speaking skills, communication, coordination and interpersonal skills should be demonstrated. Must be eligible to work in the United States.
