Document Development



ISFMP Board Initiated Draft Addendum VI	May 2019
Board Approved Draft Addendum VI for Public Comment	August 2019
Public Comment	August- September 2019
Board Considers Action on Draft Addendum	October 2019

Statement of the Problem



FMP allows only quota transfers between states with an individual state quota; regions can not currently transfer quota

Full utilization of the coastwide quota may not be possible for FY 2019 due to quota transfer limitations without Board Action.

The quota for FY 2019 has been reduced approx. 46% in response to the 2018 Stock Assessment Update. Some states may have to close their fishery early, while unused quota is available.



Background




- Fishery operates on a Fishing Year of May 1-April 30
- The Commission has a complementary plan to the Federal Joint FMP between the MAFMC and NEFMC
- Addendum III (2011) established regional (ME-CT) and state specific allocations (NY,NJ,DE,MD,VA,NC) of the coastwide quota

	Northern Region (ME-CT)	NY	NJ	DE	MD	VA	NC
Allocation	58%	2.707%	7.644%	0.896%	5.92%	10.795%	14.036%

Options on Commercial Quota Transfer Provisions

 Scoping Question on Federal Commercial Trip Limit



Management Options



- Option 1: Status Quo
 - No change; quota transfers are only allowed for states with an individual (not regional) quota



Management Options



- Option 2: Allow Quota Transfers between all states and regions
 - Region can participate in quota transfers through mutual agreement of each state in the region
 - Requires the Admin Commissioner (or proxy) from each state in the region to agree to the transfer in writing
 - Same rules regarding transfer apply
 - Transfers do not permanently affect allocations
 - Quota management and accountability based on the transferadjusted quota
 - All transfers must occur within 45 days of the end of the fishing year

Scoping Question



Should the Commission recommend that the federal commercial trip limit be eliminated and replaced by the state-by-state trip limits where they exist (NY–NC) and a regional trip limit where it exists (Northern Region of ME-CT)?



Public Comment Summary



- Public Hearings held in NH, RI (no attendees), and via Webinar
- Total of 7 written comments were received
 - Few were specific to the proposed options and scoping question
- 3 were in favor of Option 2: Allowing Quota Transfers between states and regions
 - 1 in favor of Option 1: Status Quo
- Scoping Question: whether to recommend eliminating federal trip limit
 - 1 in favor, 1 against



Public Comment Summary Cont'd



- NEFMC expressed concerns on Commission's public comment process on scoping question
- Other comments
 - High abundance has been observed around Block Island and wants to maximally harvest biomass
 - Does not want full utilization of quotas. Instead wants the quota cut by 50% immediately in all regions
 - Individual takes issue with NEFSC trawl survey; 80% of the female population is not surveyed by trawl gear; wants import data; expressed need to rename spiny dogfish for marketing
 - Commission is not complying with Article 1, Section 1 of Commission's Compact (prevent physical waste)



Spiny Dogfish 2020 Specifications



October 29, 2019

Update



- October 2019: MAFMC took no action to modify specifications for the 2020 FY
- In turn, no action is required to modify 2020 specifications for consistency with MAFMC/NEFMC FMP
- Board may chose to modify northern region trip limit for 2020 FY
 - 2019 FY: 6,000 lbs




Modify Northern Region Trip Limit (if desired)

Status of the Stock



 In 2018, spiny dogfish is not overfished and overfishing is not occurring

• (2018) Female SSB = $106,753 \text{ MT} > \text{SSB}_{\text{Target}}$

• $(2017) F = 0.202 < F_{Target}$



Commercial Quota/Landings



- May 1, 2018 April 30, 2019
- Quota was 38.19 million lbs
- Trip limit for northern region was 6,000 lbs
- Commercial landings were 16.74 million lbs
 - Approx 14% decrease from FY 2017
 - Dead discards decreased by 20% (5.3 million pounds)
- Recreational landings and dead discards decreased
 - Landings: 77,162 pounds, 73% decrease
 - 1.6 million pounds, 4% increase



State Compliance and De Minimis



- PRT reviewed all state compliance reports
- In 2018, all regions and states harvested within their quota
- All states implemented regulations consistent with the requirements of the FMP
- New York and Delaware
 - de minimis is <1% of total landings, no monitoring requirements but must report landings annually
 - Both states meet the requirements for 2018
