## MEMORANDUM

**RE:** Directed Atlantic Herring Fishery Closure for Management Area 1A

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) projects the Atlantic herring fishery will catch approximately 92% of the Area 1A sub-ACL by October 18, 2016. The Area 1A directed fishery will close effective 12:01 a.m. on October 18, 2016 and remain closed until further notice. Vessels that have entered port before 12:01 a.m. on October 18, 2016, may land and sell from that trip more than 2,000 pounds of herring from Area 1A.

Vessels participating in the herring Research Set-Aside (RSA) Program may continue to fish in Area 1A for the remainder of the fishing year, and land, subject to state landing restrictions, greater than 2,000 pounds of Atlantic herring provided they are on a declared herring RSA trip.

During a closure, vessels participating in other fisheries may retain and land an incidental catch of herring that does not exceed 2,000 pounds per trip or calendar day. In addition, directed herring vessels traveling through Area 1A must have all fishing gear stowed.

In accordance with the Amendment 3 to the Interstate Fishery Management Plan for Atlantic Herring, the fixed gear set-aside of 295 metric tons will continue to be available to fixed gear fishermen operating in Area 1A west of Cutler, Maine through December 31, 2016.

## **ATLANTIC HERRING FISHERY**

Management Area 1A Sub-ACL Harvested  
Herring catch limited to 2,000 lb per trip/day  
*Effective date:* 00:01 local time on October 18, 2016

As of 00:01 local time on October 18, 2016, vessels issued Federal Atlantic herring permits may not fish for, possess, transfer, receive, land, or sell more than 2,000 lb of herring in or from Area 1A per trip or calendar day, beginning October 18, 2016, through December 31, 2016, except that vessels that have entered port before 00:01 local time on October 18, 2016, may land and sell, from that trip, more than 2,000 lb of herring from Area 1A.

Please note that all herring vessels must land in accordance with state landing restrictions, including no landing days.

Federally permitted dealers may not receive more than 2,000 lb of herring per vessel harvested from Area 1A, per trip or calendar day, from 00:01 local time on October 18, 2016, through December 31, 2016, unless it is from a trip by a vessel that entered port before 00:01 local time on October 18, 2016, and catch is landed in accordance with state regulations.

During the closure, from October 18, 2016, through December 31, 2016, vessels may transit through Area 1A with more than 2,000 lb of herring on board, provided all herring onboard was caught outside Area 1A and all fishing gear is stowed and not available for immediate use.

As a reminder, vessels may not fish for, possess, transfer, receive, land, or sell herring from Area 1A from January 1, 2017, through May 31, 2017, and federally permitted dealers may not receive any herring from a vessel that harvested fish from Area 1A between January 1, 2017, and May 31, 2017.

Vessels participating in the Herring Research Set-Aside (RSA) program may continue to fish in Area 1A for the remainder of the fishing year, and land, subject to state landing restrictions, greater than 2,000 lb of Atlantic herring provided they are on a declared herring RSA trip. In addition, federally permitted dealers may receive greater than 2,000 lb of Atlantic herring from Area 1A provided the vessel is participating in the herring RSA program and on a declared herring RSA trip.
