## **Allocation Work Group Statement of Problem and Goals**

## Statement of the Problem

- 1. Interstate and state-federal quota allocations (state, regional, sector) are primarily based on historical landings, which are increasingly disconnected from abundance and distribution.
- 2. Most Commission FMPs do not contain reallocation criteria; reallocation becomes more difficult as time advances.
- 3. The current system for adjusting allocations disincentives change due to the perceived creation of 'winners' and 'losers' and pressure from elected officials on fishery managers.

## Allocation Work Group Goals

- 1. Establish a defined reallocation process
- 2. Allocations should address the relevant operational (e.g. infrastructure), economic, social and ecological aspects of the fishery, including new and expected changes (e.g. climate, human dimensions, technology)
- 3. Establish systems which fully utilize TAC (e.g. incentivize transfers of unused quota; create disincentives for retaining unused quota)
- 4. Explore allocation options that reduce frequency of board votes
- 5. Specify a timeframe in which to consider re-evaluation of allocation and updating of the management goals and objectives to ensure they are relevant to current conditions and needs.
- 6. Explore interactions between interstate and federal reallocation schemes
